To My Church Family:

"Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart." Hebrews 4: 12

In 1517 Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Martin Luther wanted to call out and debate the history of thinking in the church. Many argue that he was trying to start a new church, but it has been more widely agreed that he was actually not trying to leave the church but instead, to change it. And here is what we know about what happened from there. No scriptures were changed. The biblical history did not change. Instead, we had the beginning of what we call the Protestant Reformation.

"Ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda." For hundreds of years, coming out of the Protestant Reformation, the Presbyterian Church has valued these words in their teaching, preaching, understanding of scripture, and way of living out their faith. The phrase, "Reformed and always being reformed" has guided the Presbyterian tradition reminding those who belong that we are to never be stuck in what we once believed and should always be allowing ourselves to be challenged – to be changed for the better. We must remember that just because someone said it in their interpretation of scripture, does not mean their interpretation is correct. We have hundreds and hundreds of years of interpretation and understanding and discovery that has shaped where we are today, and the work is not done.

John Calvin, and other church reformers, believed that scripture should be available for all people to read and understand. They believed this, in part, because like the author of Hebrews reminds us, "the word of God is living and active." This means that in different times and in different ways, scripture comes alive, and our faith should match it. Our understanding of scripture and faith cannot stay as it once was because that time of living is gone and the future is still before us. Our faith must be living and active so that it too will come alive as we meet people in this world and so that we can be the continual loving light of Christ.

Is your faith living and active in 2025? Maybe 2024 was a tough year for you, as it was for so many people, but that is now in the past. It is time to learn from the things you did poorly and that which you did well and change the future, not just for your sake, but to the sake of the world. Things are changing and always changing – reforming and always being reformed. It is time for us to make sure that those changes – reformations – glorify God.

Preschool Families,


As we approach February, there are some important dates we would like to share with you.
